Tasmanian Support & Stimulus Package

The health, safety and wellbeing of Tasmanians is our number one priority as we face the challenge of coronavirus.

The Tasmanian Liberal Government has prepared a \$420 million stimulus package to support Tasmania as we tackle the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.



Household Assistance

Emergency Relief Package

• \$1 million over the next three months will be provided to organisations such as the Salvation Army, Red Cross and Rural Business Tasmania to support vunerable Tasmanians who are self-isolated and help support households and workers impacted by the virus.

Emergency Relief Payments for those in isolation

One-off payments of \$250 for individuals or up to \$1,000 for families, for those who are required by Public Health
to self-isolate as a result of the coronavirus. Eligibility includes those with a Health Care Card or a Pensioners
Concession Card and those on low incomes who can demonstrate a need for
financial support, including casual workers.

Accommodation Support

\$1 million emergency accommodation support will be available for individuals and families who have been placed on home quarantine but who are unable to return to their regular place of residence. This will provide additional support for our communities at this difficult time.

For other elements of the package, the Government will provide further information.

Self-isolation requires an individual to stay home or in a hotel for 14 days with no outside contact.

International travellers coming into Tasmania are also required to self-isolate for 14 days.

Supporting Primary Health & Mental Health Sectors

Supporting Primary Healthcare

\$2 million for additional support for our primary health care providers. This funding will ensure our health workers, including GPs, will have the resources needed to look after the community at this critical time.

Accommodation Support for frontline workers

\$1 million will be avaible for accomodation for frontline workers if they need to stay away from home, in circumstances where their family members are ill. This way, they can continue to contribute to our response in a safe way.

Mental Health Support

\$1 million will be provided for Mental Health Programs provided by community organisations to support individuals experiencing mental health difficulties as a result of the issues associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

We will help primary health workers to make sure they have the resources they need to look after the community.
